

***After School Religious Education....***

Enrolment forms for children attending the After School Religious Education program are available in the church foyer, the parish office and parish website. It is essential that all children have a new enrolment form filled in. Please read the Parent Information Sheet, Duty of Care Statement and **complete the form in full and return it with the fee to the parish office no later than 12 February 2010.**

Classes commence on **Tuesday, 16 February 2010 at 4.00pm** at Ss John & Paul Parish Centre, Pinetree Gully Road, Willetton. Classes are run for children from Years 1 to 7 and are held weekly during the school term. It is essential that children wishing to receive the Sacraments enrol at the start of the year and attend classes regularly as part of their preparation. The Archdiocesan policy does require children to attend the program for at least 2 years in preparation for the Sacraments.

We all desire that our children come to know and love God and our catechists, who are dedicated volunteers, endeavour to do just that. Catechesis is a very important part of our children's formation and like everything else needs nurturing and perseverance all year round and not just in time for receiving the Sacraments.
